Herman was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert J. Frazier of Dresden Ohio. He spent his entire life in Dresden and was a member of the Presbyterian Church, where he was active in the young peoples organizations and sang in the choir. He played in the Jefferson School Band and sang in the Boy's Glee Club.

He received his basic training at Camp Blanding and Fort Meade as a bugler and messenger. He was sent overseas in February 1944 and on July 9th. 1944 was wounded by German artillery fire near Rosignano, Italy while serving as a rifleman and grenadier. He died on July 17th., 1944 at an Army hospital and is buried in a U.S. Military Cemetery at Follonica Italy.

He is survived by his parents and one brother, Robert Arthur Frazier, who served as a lieutenant in the Medical Administrative Corps.
