Citation for Silver Star-Posthumous

Marion L. Gibson, 35225410, Private First Class, Company G, 26th Infantry. For gallantry in action in the vicinity of Schevenhutte, Germany, 19 November 1944. When his company's outer positions were partly overrun by the enemy during a fierce counterattack, Provate Gibson unhesitatingly exposed himself to an intense machine-gun, automatic-rifle, and small-arms barrage and encouraged his equad to hold firm. Although his movements drew hostile fire upon himself, he continued to remain in an exposed position and directed the men in repulsing the attack. Private Gibson's gallant actions and inspiring leadership reflect great credit upon the army of the United States. Residence at enlistment: South Zanesville, Ohio. Next of kin: Mrs. Thelma L. G, bson, Mother, R. F. D. 2, South Zanesville, Ohio.
