S. Sgt. Donald R. Tewksbury, born December 1, 1908 in Muskingum Co. Ohio. Graduated from Zanesville High School in 1925, attended Meredith Business College and was at the time of induction an employee of Hazel-Atlas Glass Co. Inducted in June of 1942 and was with the 79th Division, 315th Infantry Co. B. Serial #35406107. Left this country April 4th, 1944 and landed in France on the 12th of June 1944. Participated in the Battle of Cherbourg and was listed as Missing in Action near St. Lo on July 22nd 1944. The War Department has officially listed Sgt. Tewksbury as killed in Action at the time he was listed as missing in Action.
