

A Letter from Stacey about

Rine-Hree

Hopefully by now, you've heard our exciting news: we are late-fine-free! The Muskingum County Library System (MCLS) has a history of removing barriers to resources dating back to our time as the Zanesville Athenaeum. In the 1870s, the John McIntire Estate gave money to the Athenaeum with the condition that high school students be able to use the library free of charge. In 1904, the taxpayers of the city of Zanesville felt they should also be entitled to free library service. The "subscription library" model changed to a free one in 1905, and any resident of the city of Zanesville could check out materials. In 1914, the Board President made a radical suggestion that the library should be open to farmers in the county. Anyone in Muskingum County could then become a library cardholder by paying one dollar per year. Finally, in 1932, all residents of Muskingum County could patronize the library for free.

As you can see, we have a history dating back over 150 years of removing barriers to library materials for Muskingum County residents. Being late-fine-free is one more step to providing access to library materials and resources for everyone in Muskingum County!

Why is this important? Even though the library and library materials and services are free to the community, overdue fines can keep people away from the library and inequitably restrict access to library resources. Going late-fine-free will remove barriers for our customers, so more people can enjoy the library!

What does this mean to you? Due dates still apply. However, it means if you are a day or so late, it's okay! But it is not okay to never return library materials or to return them damaged. Library customers will still be responsible for lost or damaged items so we can share them with others in the community







Late-Fine-Free QS-A

Question: Won't people just not return items?

Answer: Many public libraries across the country have moved to a fine-free model, and there has not been a significant increase in the number of lost items. This is mostly due to the fact that lost items on a patron's account result in lost fees and suspension of their library card privileges. We also use our Materials Recovery Program to get checked-out items back on the shelf quickly for the next library patron.

Q: Don't late fines provide funding to the library?

A: In the past three years, less than one percent (0.34%) of the budget was from fines, and the cost of collecting fines comes close to exceeding the amount collected.

Q: Will we run out of items on the shelf?

#2: We will not run out of items on the shelf. In April 2022, only 7.6% of the total MCLS collection was checked out. We also have librarians and assistant librarians who check usage and gaps and then purchase additional copies based on the needs, wants, and trends in our community.

Q: What about teaching people personal responsibility?

A: There are still consequences for not returning library items. Patrons will pay for lost or damaged items or lose library card privileges.

Q: Will I have to wait longer for my holds?

A: Currently 75% of our holds are filled in three days and 87% are filled in ten days. We have our librarians and assistant librarians monitoring and purchasing based on wait times. During this transition, we will be keeping an even closer eye on hold times to ensure they are not negatively impacted.






Top 5 In-Person Checkouts















